C. LEGAL COUNSEL:

Moved by Lucas, seconded by Spaulding, that the law firm of Bauer, Florip, & Wojda PLC be retained as the Alpena County Road Commission's Attorneys for 2025. Motion carried unanimously.

SET REGULAR MEETING TIME, DATES AND PLACE FOR 2025

Moved by Spaulding, seconded by Lucas, that the regular meetings of the Board of County Road Commissioners of Alpena County for 2025 be held on the first Tuesday of each month at 3:00 p.m. unless a second meeting is needed, in the lower-level conference room at the Road Commission offices. CHECKING ACCOUNT DEPOSITORY

Moved by Spaulding, seconded by Lucas, to designate Huntington Bank as the checking account depository for the General Road Fund, Payroll Account, and Accounts Payable Account for 2025. Also, Huntington Bank, PNC Bank, Nicolet, or any other Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation or a savings and loan association which is a member of the Federal Savings and Loan Insurance Corporation or a credit union which is insured by the National Credit Union Administration maintaining an office in the County that is authorized by statute, be designated as depositories for County Road Funds. Motion carried unanimously.

CHECK SIGNATURE AUTHORIZATION

Moved by Lucas, seconded by Spaulding, that Ryan Brege, Managing Director, and Julia Patterson, Finance Director/Board Secretary, are hereby authorized to sign checks for the Payroll Account and for the Accounts Payable Account. Motion carried unanimously.

ATTORNEY'S RETAINER FEE AGREEMENT

Moved by Spaulding, seconded by Lucas, to authorize the Chairman and Board Secretary to sign the annual Retainer Agreement, with the law firm of Bauer, Florip, and Wojda PLC, for one year, from January 1, 2025, to December 31, 2025. The annual retainer fee of \$15,600 per year, payable monthly as the same accrues, at the rate of \$1,300 per month. Retained services in excess of 70 hours of legal services shall be billed as additional charges. The Attorneys shall provide a semi-annual billing, showing services performed and time expended on Retained Services. Any additional legal work outside the scope of routine legal work will be at the standard hourly rate charged by the attorney handling the type of service, to the maximum of \$225.00 per hour, plus out-of-pocket expenses. Motion carried unanimously.

AMEND CREDIT CARD POLICY #051

PA 266 of 1995

(UPDATES HIGHLIGHTED)

WHEREAS, Public Act 266 of 1995 authorizes a county road commission to be a party to a credit card arrangement if the county road commission board has adopted by resolution a written policy governing the control and use of credit cards, and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Road Commissioners of Alpena County deems that it is in the best interest of the County Road Commission to make certain County Road Commission financial transactions by using a credit card as described in the Act, now

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the following policy shall govern the use of County Road Commission credit cards:

(a) The Finance Director is responsible for issuing, accounting for, monitoring, retrieving and generally overseeing compliance with the County Road Commission's credit card policy.

(b) County Road Commission credit cards may be used only by an officer or employee of the County Road Commission for the purchase of goods or services for the official business of the County Road Commission. The use of a credit card is limited to purchases up to \$2,500.00, for the payment of travel, meals and accommodation expenses while on County Road Commission business (excluding expenses incurred in operating a privately owned automobile) and gas, oil and other necessary expenses incurred in operating a County Road Commission-owned vehicle. A credit card may be used for purchases in excess of \$2,500.00 if such item is included in a current Board approved budget or in the event of an emergency under the direction of the Managing Director.

(c) County Road Commission officers and employees who use a County Road Commission credit card shall, as soon as possible, submit a copy of the vendor's credit card slip to the Finance Director. If no credit card slip was obtained that described the transaction, the employee shall submit a signed

voucher that shows the name of vendor or entity from which goods or services were purchased, the date and the amount of the transaction, the official business that required the transaction, and the chart of account number indicating the line item to which the transaction is to be charged. All credit card slips shall include this information as well. Vouchers shall also include a statement why a credit card slip was not obtained.

(d) An official or employee who is issued a credit card is responsible for its protection and custody. If a credit card is lost or stolen, the Finance Director shall be notified. The entity issuing the lost or stolen credit card shall be immediately notified to cancel the card.

(e) An officer or employee issued a credit card shall return the credit card to the Finance Director upon termination of his or her employment or service with the County Road Commission.

(f) The Finance Director shall maintain a list of all credit cards owned by the County Road Commission, along with the name of the officer and employee who has been issued the credit card, the credit limit established, the date issued, and the date returned. Each employee shall initial the list beside his or her name to indicate agreement that the credit card has been issued, and that the employee has received and read a copy of this policy.

The Finance Director shall review each credit card statement as soon as possible to ensure that transactions comply with this policy. Any transactions that appear on the statements that are not documented with a credit card slip or a signed voucher shall be immediately investigated. Transactions that do not appear to comply with this policy shall be reported to the Board of County Road Commissioners for Alpena County.

(g) The County Road Commission Board shall not approve a payment to the entity issuing the credit card until all transactions have been verified, including the approval of all transaction invoices if issued.

(h) The balance including interest due on an extension of credit' under the credit card arrangement shall be paid for within not more than 60 days of the initial statement date.

(i) Officers and employees who use a County Road Commission credit card in a manner contrary to this policy shall be subject to the following disciplinary actions, as deemed appropriate by the County Road Commission Board:

verbal counseling

written reprimand

suspension

termination

reimbursement to the County Road Commission for unauthorized expenditures.

(j) The total amount of outstanding charges on the account shall not exceed the total credit limit on the account, currently \$10,000.00.

(k) The Managing Director, Finance Director/Board Secretary, Office Clerk, and Foremen are designated as the Alpena County Road Commission staff authorized to carry and use a road commission credit card.

Commissioner MacArthur recommended that Beaver Lake Road be added to the 2026 draft budget with Ossineke Township offering to pay \$200,000 towards that primary road project. Two miles of Beaver Lake Road, from Glazier to Wolf Creek Road, at a budgeted cost of \$1.6 million was added to the 2026 draft budget.

The capital outlay for road equipment was discussed and it was decided to have the Road Commission crew try out a CAT 317 excavator.

December 2, 2025

The draft budget will continue to be reviewed by Mr. Brege and Finance Director Julie Patterson as the year progresses. The final budget will be submitted to the Board for their review/approval at a subsequent meeting.

Mr. Brege informed the Board that there are two creek crossings that will involve EGLE. This process will delay the project too late into the construction season. Commissioner MacArthur inquired if Beaver Lake Road design engineering was included in the 2026 budget. RFP's will be sent out and will be received at the February 3, 2026 board meeting.

After a review of the capital outlay for road equipment, a water pump was added to the list for a budgeted amount of \$20,000. Chairman MacArthur closed the public hearing at 1:26 p.m.
